COMFORT SYSTEMS USA (SOUTH CENTRAL) HONORED WITH 2011 EXCELLENCE IN CONSTRUCTION MERIT AWARD FOR SPECIALTY CONTRACTOR - MECHANICAL



HOUSTON, Texas – October 20, 2011 – Comfort Systems USA (South Central), a wholly owned subsidiary of Comfort Systems USA (NYSE: FIX), the nation's premier provider of mechanical systems installation and services, is proud to be the recipient of the Associated Builders and Contractors (ABC) 2011 Excellence in Construction Merit Award for the Sysco Food Services of Houston project.

As a Design-Build Project, Comfort Systems USA (South Central) worked with Sysco Food Service and Big-D Construction to develop designs for plumbing and air conditioning systems. The design had to accommodate the approximately 585,000 square foot facility, its 700 employees and guests. This included a full service state of the art "Chef's

Kitchen” designed to accommodate video and web broadcast of the Chef in action. The facility operates 24-hours a day, 300 plus days per year and was designed to handle up to \$30 million in inventory annually. One innovative change incorporated midway through the project was the change from lead-acid batteries powering the forklifts and pallet jacks to Hydrogen Fuel Cell power lowering the carbon footprint. Special plumbing and controls accommodations were installed to facilitate this change. Specialized floor drains to catch condensation and special controls systems designed to turn fans on when hydrogen is detected were installed. Even with the special nature of the project, Comfort Systems USA (South Central) was able to adapt and adjust plans and designs to accommodate the clients’ needs, on time and within budget.

Construction of this project started in October of 2008 and the building was turned over to the owner in February 2010. Comfort Systems USA (South Central) completed this project with zero OSHA Safety recordable accidents, zero OSHA restricted workday cases and zero OSHA lost time accidents.
